Text – Psalm 23:6

#### A. “Surely \_\_\_\_\_...Shall Follow Me” (23:6a)

### II. \_\_\_\_\_ – “I will dwell in the house of the LORD for ever.” (23:6b)

#### A. \_\_\_\_\_ Promise – “I will dwell” (23:6b)

1. \_\_\_\_\_ (Psalm 27:5; 26:8; 84:4)

#### B. \_\_\_\_\_ Place – “the house of the LORD.” (23:6b)

1. Who is forever welcome “in the house?”
2. How does one come to “dwell in the house of the LORD?”
  - a. He has the key – \_\_\_\_\_.

#### C. Place of \_\_\_\_\_ – “for ever” (23:6b)
